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Part A: State Information

Data from the single year United States Census Bureau American Community Surveys as well as the estimates for the five year surveys are shown on the next pages. Florida and United States estimates from the American Community Survey from 2016, 2017 and 2018 are shown as well as estimates from the American Community Survey 5-year (2014-2018). Data is shown for the six FDDC regions in Florida as well as Florida and the United States when available. Some data from the 2013-2017 5-year surveys are shown when it was not available for the newer years.

DATA FOR THE SIX FDDC REGIONS, RURAL AND URBAN COUNTIES, FLORIDA AND THE UNITED STATES

When reporting available data by FDDC regions, Rural Counties and Urban County groupings are also shown. The counties included in each region or county grouping is below.

Southeast Region (6 Counties): Broward, Indian River, Martin, Okeechobee, Palm Beach and St. Lucie.

Southern Region (2 Counties): Miami-Dade and Monroe.

Rural Counties (32 Counties): Baker, Bradford, Calhoun, Columbia, DeSoto, Dixie, Flagler, Franklin, Gadsden, Gilchrist, Glades, Gulf, Hamilton, Hardee, Hendry, Highlands, Holmes, Jackson, Jefferson, Lafayette, Levy, Liberty, Madison, Nassau, Okeechobee, Putnam, Suwannee, Taylor, Union, Wakulla, Walton and Washington.

Urban Counties (35 Counties): Alachua, Bay, Brevard, Broward, Charlotte, Citrus, Clay, Collier, Duval, Escambia, Hernando, Hillsborough, Indian River, Lake, Lee, Leon, Manatee, Marion, Martin, Miami-Dade, Monroe, Okaloosa, Orange, Osceola, Palm Beach, Pasco, Pinellas, Polk, St. Johns, St. Lucie, Santa Rosa, Sarasota, Seminole, Sumter and Volusia.



















MEDICAID

The state of Florida operates and provides health insurance coverage to Floridians mainly through its Statewide Medicaid Managed Care (SMMC) program. Aside from the SMMC program, there is also the Program for All Inclusive Care for Elderly (PACE) and fee for service (FFS). The SMMC program is comprised of three separate entities: Managed Medical Assistance (MMA), Long-Term Care (LTC), and Dental.

There are four different types of MMA plans: MMAC (Capitated), MMACC (Child Welfare Capitated), MMASC (Specialty Capitated), CMSMA (Children's Medical Services Network). MMAC provides coverage for recipients of TANF, SSI Medicaid Only, SSI Duals, and LTC. MMACC provides coverage specifically for children in the care of DCF. MMASC is used to provide managed care for disease management, which is broken down by distinct diagnosis or chronic condition. These diseases and chronic conditions include HIV/ AIDS, Serious Mental Illness, CVD, COPD, CHF, Diabetes. CMSMA provides care for children with "special healthcare needs."

When addressing LTC, it is important to note that the numbers given for LTC are already included in the total Medicaid count. LTC is comprised of LTC MMA, which includes LTC MMAC and MMASC; LTC fee for service (FFS). Total LTC is broken out as HCBS Waiver and non-HCBS Waiver, to show the breakdown between the two, within total LTC.








FIGURE 13. EXCEPTIONAL STUDENTS WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES BY RACE, FDDC REGION, FLORIDA, 2019-2020.






